## 1. Introduction

This paper comes from the Convenor and Secretary of the Assembly Arrangements Committee. It has not been considered in the Committee because (a) it responds to concerns that have arisen quite recently, and (b) it asks Mission Council to make plans for a situation in which the Committee's normal remit cannot be fulfilled.

## 2. Coronavirus and the General Assembly

- 2.1 Some concern has been expressed about the possible effect of the Coronavirus Covid-19 on the General Assembly. While it remains our firm intention to hold the Assembly in the University of Aston on the appointed dates, we have to accept that other arrangements may have to be made.
- 2.2 For over 70 years the Presbyterian Church and now the United Reformed Church as its successor, in appointing the venue and dates of the Assembly have inserted a formula allowing for either or both of these to be changed when necessary. Resolution 21 of the 2018 Assembly specifically allows for the Assembly to meet in "such other time and place as may be duly determined".
- 2.3 Hitherto any decision to do this has been taken by Mission Council, but in a situation of rapid change where Mission Council will not meet again before the Assembly, it would seem wise to make provision for a small group to be appointed to act if needed. Accordingly Mission Council is requested to authorise the Officers of Assembly to make any requisite decisions.

## 3. Officers of Assembly

- 3.1 For information, the Officers of Assembly are the two serving Moderators, the Clerk, Treasurer and General Secretary, and the Convenor of Assembly Arrangements.
- 3.2 Should the Assembly's plans to meet at Aston be postponed or cancelled, Mission Council is asked to determine that Clare Downing and Peter Pay shall be the Assembly's serving Moderators from 13 July 2020. When the Assembly does eventually meet, it will surely wish to induct them to role; but plans for this will have to be set nearer the time.
- 3.3 The above proposal violates the normal principle that a Moderator's office begins with induction to the role. It breaks the normal principle because it is a provision for abnormal circumstances.
- 3.4 Mission Council is also asked to direct that the Assembly Arrangements Committee hand over its work to the Business Committee on 13 July (as is already planned), and that the Convenor of the Business Committee, Adrian Bulley, succeed James Breslin as an Officer of Assembly.
